Blaire Gould is a Mi'kmaw from Eskasoni First Nation and is currently employed at Mi'kmaw Kina'matnewey (MK) as the Mi'kmaw Language Early Literacy Coordinator. She has been working in the area of language revitalization and survival of the Mi'kmaw language with MK communities and partnership organizations such as Nova Scotia's Department of Education and Early Childhood Development, Tripartite, Confederacy of Mainland Mi'kmaq, Cape Breton University, and St. Francis Xavier University. She works closely with a group of Mi'kmaw Advisors, a team of community representatives who all hold great knowledge combined with current and retired teachers and specialists in the Mi'kmaw language. They value their success in achieving goals with a work-plan. As an app developer, her team successfully published over 15 apps in two years.

**Yolanda Denny** has been working at Mi'kmaw Kina'matnewey since graduating from St.FX with her B.Ed in 2005. She started as a Mi'kmaw Language Specialist, then joined the FNSSP team as the Mi'kmaw Language Consultant in 2009.

Abstract: This session will discuss what Mi'kmaw Kina'matnewey has done in the efforts of revitalization, preservation, and continuation of the Mi'kmaq language to educators, community members, and students. The session will share highlight of projects that specifically involve Mi'kmaq language.
