The President is responsible for assisting the Board of Governors in carrying out the mandate of the SICC. The President is responsible for the overall operation of the Centre and to provide effective leadership to achieve the mission and objectives of the Saskatchewan Indigenous Cultural Centre on behalf of the First Nations of Saskatchewan. The President is accountable to the Board of Governors for the effective and efficient operation of the Centre as well as to ensure the Centre's conformity to its Bylaws, Articles of Incorporation, and with approved policies of the Board

The ideal candidate will bring the following professional attributes, experience and knowledge:

- Proven sound business and administrative organizations skills to manage the operation of the Centre in an efficient and cost-effective manner;
- Knowledge and experience with curriculum writing and development;
- Knowledge and experience with program development;

- Reports on the progress and achievements of the Centre to the Board of Governors, FSIN Treasury Board, Saskatchewan Indian Education & Training Commission and the Chiefs in Assembly.

Qualifications:

- Master's Degree in Education or Administration, or related area of studies
- Ability to speak a First Nation language
- Extensive knowledge of First Nations cultures, histories, protocols, practices, values and traditions
- Strong experience reporting to, and working with, a Board of Governors
